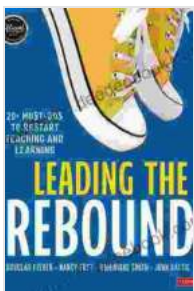


20 Must-Dos to Restart Teaching and Learning Effectively

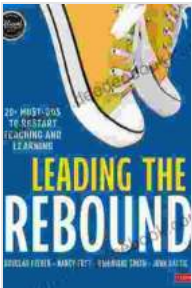
19. Celebrate Successes

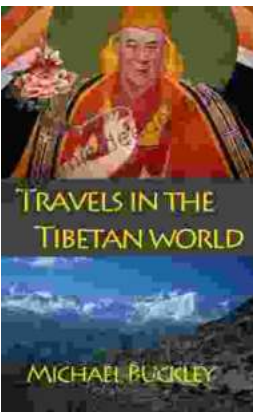
