

# Gore Vidal: A Literary Giant of the 20th Century





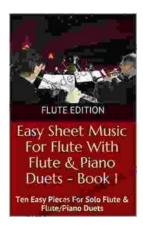
