

Ralph Waldo Emerson

Ralph Waldo Emerson was born in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1803. He graduated from Harvard College in 1821 and then studied divinity at

Harvard Divinity School. However, he soon abandoned his plans to become a minister and instead turned to writing and lecturing. Emerson's first book, Essays: First Series, was published in 1841 and was a critical and commercial success. He followed this up with a second series of essays in 1844 and then went on to publish a number of other works, including Representative Men (1850),The Conduct of Life (1860),and Society and Solitude (1870).

Emerson's writings are characterized by their optimism, their emphasis on the importance of individual self-reliance, and their celebration of the natural world. He believed that all people have the potential to achieve great things if they only trust in themselves and follow their own instincts. He also believed that the natural world is a source of great wisdom and beauty and that we should all strive to live in harmony with nature.

Henry David Thoreau

Henry David Thoreau was born in Concord, Massachusetts, in 1817. He graduated from Harvard College in 1837 and then worked as a teacher, surveyor, and pencil maker. In 1845, he built a small cabin on the shores of Walden Pond and lived there for two years, during which time he wrote his most famous work, Walden. Thoreau's other works include A Week on the Concord and Merrimack Rivers (1849),The Maine Woods (1864),and Cape Cod (1865).

Thoreau's writings are characterized by their close observation of nature, their celebration of the simple life, and their critique of materialism and consumerism. He believed that we should all strive to live in harmony with nature and that we should not be afraid to question the status quo. He also believed that the best way to live is to live a simple life, free from the distractions of modern society.




